DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL AND REASON FOR APPLICATION

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ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Council has set out the objective and decision guidelines that the municipal building surveyor will exercise when considering varying a design and siting standard for fencing.

Note: If any matter set out in the guideline is not met, then Council **must refuse** consent.

Objective: To allow adequate daylight into habitable room windows.

Decision Guidelines: The reporting authority may give its consent where a fence does not comply with regulation 428 of the Building Regulations 2006 (as ratified by Council), if -

- (a) the fence will not impact on the amenity of existing dwellings on nearby allotments; or
